The project will be held in Bethlehem and Jerusalem, two cities with an extensive history of conflict.

Throughout the mobility and training, one of our main goals is to support dialogue, integration and cooperation despite the boundaries created at the local, national and international level by using non-formal education methods.

DESCRIPTION


PROFILE OF PARTICIPANTS"
