Project Overview



"Building Together a Harmonious Society" is a youth workers' mobility project aimed at combating disinformation, xenophobia, and Muslim hatred while promoting diversity, empathy, and positive social change.

The project is funded by the European Commission and supported by JUGEND für Europa (German National Agency). Over the course of ten days, this project will bring together youth workers from different countries to participate in a series of non-formal learning activities and engage with local communities in Berlin.

Vision



Project Objectives

- Empowering Youth Workers: To provide non-formal learning opportunities for the educational and professional development of youth workers, equipping them with skills and knowledge to address social challenges effectively.
- Promoting Intercultural Understanding: To promote intercultural dialogue and understanding among youth workers, encouraging them to be agents of positive change in diverse societies.
- Combating Disinformation: To raise awareness about the impact of digital media on the dissemination of disinformation and hate speech, and equip youth workers with tools to identify and counter false information.
- Tackling Xenophobia and anti-Muslim
 hatred: To build empathy and understanding,
 specifically addressing xenophobia and anti Muslim prejudice, and fostering a culture of
 acceptance and inclusion.
- Sharing Good Practices: To share good practices such as digital tools, websites, and sources that provide accurate information about different cultures and religions

Activity Highlights

- Teambuilding and Exploration: Through team-building exercises and exploring iconic sites like the Berlin Wall, participants bond and familiarize themselves with each other and the city's history.
- Unmasking Disinformation: We delve into the realm of disinformation, exploring its impacts and origins. Workshops and interactive sessions develop participants' media literacy, equipping them to navigate the digital landscape with critical thinking.
- Confronting Prejudice and Fostering
 Harmony: This day involves workshops decoding xenophobia and anti-Muslim hatred, creating a safe space for dialogue, understanding, and embracing diversity.
- Engage, Connect, and Empower: Through immersive outdoor activities, participants discover methods of inclusion, while engaging with the local partners adds a creative dimension to social inclusion efforts.
- Culmination and Reflection: Group
 presentations showcase projects inspired
 by Erasmus+ ideals. The Youthpass
 Ceremony and closing reflections mark
 participants' growth and achievements.
